BOSTON MASSACHUSETTS

Boston (www.bostonusa.com) is a dynamic city steeped in history, culture, old world charm, and cosmopolitan sophistication. A Cradle of Liberty for the American Revolution, many of its historic sites can be experienced on foot (www.nps.gov/bost). Restaurants to suit any taste and budget are plentiful. Free time can be spent relaxing on Boston Common, viewing exhibits at the Museum of Fine Arts, Museum of Science, or New England Aquarium, shopping on Newbury Street, kayaking or canoeing along the Charles River, visiting the campuses of Harvard, MIT, or 40 other nearby colleges and universities.

ACCOMMODATIONS

The Boston Park Plaza Hotel and Towers (www.boston-parkplaza.com) is located in the heart of downtown Boston. Superbly located, the hotel is a few minutes walk from the Public Gardens, Boston Common, Copley Square, Newbury Street, and many of Boston's most historic sites. Built in 1927 and fresh off a \$20 million room renovation the hotel provides the latest in technology and guestroom comfort while preserving the building's historic integrity. The hotel is easily accessible by public transportation and is less than 3 miles from Logan International Airport.

Direct airline flights are available from many national and international locations into Boston's Logan International Airport. Train and bus service into Boston are available from New York City and other "northeast corridor" locations. Garage parking is available for participants who will be traveling to the meeting by car.
