Families can request appointments for their children from the Children's website. The feature is called "Request an Appointment" and is located in the top right corner of our homepage. You'll also find a link to this feature on the main page of every department and program that offers this service.

The request goes to a representative in the requested department or program, who will follow-up with the requestor within two business days. The requestor can even leave a window of time when it might be best to call back, helping to eliminate rounds of phone tag.

Since the program was launched, 35 departments and 213 programs have signed up to accept patient requests online. The response from families has been very positive. Requests have come in from throughout New England and New York, and as far away as Texas and Alaska.
