2013 Summer Internship





Clinical Education and Informatics Department

What is it?

The summer student internship program is open to high school students starting from rising sophomore to senior year.

The program will place you in patient service areas throughout Children's Hospital Boston. There are ten positions available. During your internship you will learn more about the delivery of healthcare and will participate as a team member in the care of our patients.

When is it?

The internship lasts for 6 weeks. Starts on Monday, July 8, 2013 and will end on Thursday, August 15, 2013.



What will I do?

The internship is for you to work at Children's Hospital, Boston 24 hours per week throughout the internship period. You will spend 22 hours of that time working alongside a mentor in a patient services area. Your mentor will help and support you throughout the internship. Some of this time can be spent shadowing in particular units that interest you. Throughout the internship you will also be working on developing a project to be presented at the end of the program. Once a week you will be given the opportunity to meet with the other interns and share your experiences.

By the end of the summer...

You should be able to do the following:

- ◆□ Describe the roles and functions of patient services disciplines in a pediatric hospital setting.
- ◆□ Participate as a team member in a selected patient services area.
- ◆□ Share with others what you learned through your experience or how you fulfilled a need in your unit.

Are you interested?

You will need to do the following:

- ◆□ Fill out the application Excel format. No other formats will be accepted.
- ◆□ Submit a 500-word essay on why you would like to work in the health care field.
- ◆□ Two letters of recommendation from people who can say why you are a good candidate for the program

The application period will be from Monday, December 31, 2012 until Friday, March 1, 2013.
