

Professional Day Fee Schedule



- 2 hour program: \$500
- 3 hour program: \$750
- 4 hour program: \$1000
- 5 hour program: \$1250
- 6 hour program: \$1500

What is included in the fee?

Lectures by BCH professionals, program coordinator facilitator, nursing contact hours, PDP's and electronic handouts. Additional Fees for travel to programs that are outside of a 50-mile radius from Boston Children's Hospital will be added onto the program costs listed above.

Once your day's agenda has been confirmed you will receive an email confirming dates/times and an invoice based on confirmed agenda. You will then need to generate a purchase order for the program. The purchase order needs to be on file in our office prior to the program date. Once the professional development program has taken place your district's business office will receive the final invoice.

*Many school districts have the same dates set aside for professional development. If you've booked a virtual training, there may be multiple districts in attendance if the topic(s) you have selected has been requested by others.


